RAAC update There has been a lot of media coverage of RAAC in the last 24 hours, following the decision not to reopen some schools in England. We appreciate this may be giving you some cause for concern. As we highlighted yesterday, with surveys ongoing, we do not have a complete picture of how much RAAC may be present in our buildings. 54 buildings - or parts of buildings - are being checked, because based on their age and building type there is a possibility that RAAC was used in their construction. The safety of you, patients, and visitors is paramount, and we want to have certainty about whether RAAC is present, hence the surveys. We have made very good progress with these, with just a few buildings in Aberdeen now remaining; thank you again to everyone involved for their support, which has allowed us to move more quickly than initially planned. Formal survey reports will be produced, and we will share more information when we have these, but please be assured, if we are given any initial feedback suggesting action is needed, we will liaise directly with those in the building affected.

NHS Grampian maternity charter We have launched a Maternity Charter, developed with the Grampian Maternity Voices Partnership and LATNEM (Let's All Talk North East Mums) along with NHS staff, to ensure people using maternity services across Grampian are aware of their rights and responsibilities. HEPMA update The HEPMA roll out across ARI is at the halfway point and well on track to complete at the end of October as planned. A breakdown of current HEPMA activity is attached to the email used to send out today's brief. The key message from the team is to complete the training required to access HEPMA. The training is free, and the team will support you throughout. The accredited training will be completed over an approximate period of 10 weeks. This includes a training session, a summary of achievement, an observation of practice and a SCQF level 5 certificate on completion. Spaces are limited to 10.
