**Locking of Clinical Waste eurobins** Please can all staff be reminded that it is a mandatory requirement to ensure our clinical wastes are secure from public access at all times.

This means that all eurobins must be locked at all times – lids should never be left open or unlocked, and bags of waste should not be left on top of bins.

A printable poster to act as a reminder can be found in the Waste section of the Facilities & Estates intranet page, or by clicking the link Bin locking poster.

There is also a Tool Box Talk - Safe Use of Large Eurobins (028-2018) which all relevant staff should review.

The issue of unlocked eurobins was raised as an area of concern when the HSE visited Foresterhill in 2016, so it is imperative that all staff take responsibility to ensure these are always locked. If you come across an unlocked yellow eurobin, please lock it.
