COVID-19Brief




Here is the brief for Friday 18 March 2022.

COVID-19 Update This has been one of the most challenging weeks for health and social care - and what is experienced on the ground is borne out in the data. There has been unrelenting demand for medical unscheduled care and whilst covid comprises about 10% in bed occupancy, its effects are disproportionate, leading to significant disruption through ward closures, care home outbreaks and the availability of health and social care staff. Our current covid rates of 1,468 per 100k, are three times higher than in the thick of winter just as Omicron was becoming dominant in mid-December.

Our weekly <u>situation update video</u> highlights that cases are rising across all age groups but especially in those 50+ years and in children up to 18 years. Admissions to hospitals are also increasing in all age groups with approximately 45% being admitted specifically for covid. This is a tough time for us. But again, the collective efforts of our operational staff on a day to day, hour by hour basis is making what seems like the unmanageable, manageable.

Flu cases Public Health Scotland has issued an alert following an increase in flu cases across the country. PHS said the level had risen to 2.2 cases per 100,000, suggesting "the onset of the influenza season in Scotland, which is relatively late compared to previous years".

The alert recommended: "It is important that the NHS remains vigilant to the potential for any further increases in influenza and other non-COVID respiratory pathogens. This is especially important where people develop influenza symptoms, are negative for COVID-19, and clinicians consider them at risk of the development of complications of their infection (e.g. by inclusion in a clinical risk group).

"Clinicians in the community are advised that consideration should be given to testing for other respiratory infections as soon as symptoms start in those patients in clinical risk groups, or in the event of clinical deterioration in any patient. Patients presenting to hospital with flu-like symptoms should be assessed using local investigation pathways."
