Web Filter Change/Connectivity Issues – Suspension of Teams recording Owing to ongoing capacity issues related to the Web Filter we require to ensure connectivity is maintained to critical clinical services. Analysis is showing that a large proportion of the traffic is related to Teams. To alleviate pressure on the connectivity we will prevent the recording of Teams video calls, effective immediately.


In terms of additional measures, when on a Teams call if you can switch your video off this will have a positive impact also. In the meantime, eHealth are currently working with the vendors to identify a resolution for these problems and all efforts are being made to resolve this as soon as possible.

Vaccination programme staffing opportunities Are you a registered professional with NMC, GMC, GDC, GPhC, GOC or HCPC? Did you know you can register to do additional hours and be paid at your current grade/band to support this vital campaign to protect the public and NHS services? As this work is through your current contract, your pay will attract any enhancements such as overtime. Once registered, the rostering team will set you up on the HealthRoster system and provide you with login details for Employee on Line (EOL). If you need a shadow shift and induction the vaccination service will be in touch to get this booked and get you started. Booking shifts thereafter can be done through your mobile device and you will have the same access to shifts as bank workers.

There is no obligation to do regular set work and you can choose what shift are best for you. If you are already on the bank as a vaccinator at Band 5 do not worry this process also applies to you and you will be able to continue to contribute but now at your substantive rates. There are clinics across Grampian to choose from (Aberdeen City, Inverurie, Huntly, Peterhead, Fraserburgh, Stonehaven, Macduff and Banchory). Hospital at Home – Shire Supported Discharge (H@H-SSD) As we develop the phased implementation of the model, an initial focus is set on early discharge from the acute hospital for frail older patients who might otherwise have had an extended hospital stay. This creates capacity within the system whilst also allowing for ongoing learning and evaluation to determine what a full Hospital at Home service could look like for Aberdeenshire. The aim of this service is to reduce the length of stay for these patients and provide enhanced support to prevent readmission with the added benefit of reducing the disablement which is so often experienced whilst residing in the hospital environment. Presently patients are discharged to primary care, following a CGA, and supported home by the H@H-SSD team allowing assessment and rehab and enablement in their home environment.

The H@H-SSD team are currently running information sessions which cover how to access the service, patient criteria, service processes, geographical coverage and the opportunity ask any questions you may have. The next block of information sessions will run weekly on a **Tuesday** from the 23 November to 14 December. <u>To join the Tuesday sessions at 10.30am please use this Teams link</u>.
