Winter vaccinations – Moray drop-ins The Fiona Elcock Vaccination Centre is now able to accept drop-ins by health & social care staff for Winter vaccinations. The centre is open Monday – Friday, 10.30am - 5.30pm. As with all other drop-in opportunities, at peak times queues may close and you may be asked to come back at another date/time.

Please note, all Aberdeen clinics are appointment **only**, there are no drop-in opportunities for staff or the public in the city.
