Windows 10 Updates Over the coming weeks eHealth will be performing essential updates to Windows 10 devices across the organisation. Although we already have Windows 10 installed there are critical updates to be performed which introduce feature updates, but more importantly fix known bugs and vulnerabilities. These updates are mandatory; we understand not all PCs/Laptops can be updated instantly so you will start to see messages (see below) advising an upgrade is available.



This upgrade should be performed as soon as practically possible otherwise the update will be automatically applied. eESS downtime 26-29 May 2023 The eESS system will be unavailable for all Boards from **4pm on Friday 26 May until 12noon on Monday 29 May**. This downtime will affect Core, ER, Self Service, OBIEE, and OLM. The payroll interface will also be suspended during this period, so all required transactions should be completed by **1pm on Friday 26 May**. Once restarted the queued transactions will continue as normal for all Boards. The SSTS interface will also be suspended from 4pm Friday 26 May until 12noon on Monday 29 May and once restarted the queued transactions will continue as normal. The downtime is needed to upgrade the eESS database, and steps have been taken to minimise the downtime.
