Cyber-attacks and cyber security There have been clear examples of cyber-attacks affecting healthcare providers, nationally and internationally and including a Scottish health board, this week. We in Grampian are not affected, but we cannot afford to be complacent. While we have robust procedures in place, we are constantly reviewing these, and we all have a role to play in keeping our systems secure and confidential information safe.

Be on the lookout for phishing emails, ensure your passwords meet our security requirements, and if you are away from your device, lock it! The 'Do IT Securely' training, available on Turas, is mandatory and should be completed annually. This helpful guide was compiled for Cyber Security Week.
