Storm Babet Firstly, thank you to all of you for your various efforts today to keep services running during the challenging weather. Above all else, keep yourself and your colleagues safe.

The Met Office are regularly updating their forecasts, with the most serious Red weather warning set to take effect from 6pm this evening and covering south Aberdeenshire (Stonehaven, Inverbervie, and Laurencekirk amongst others). Please check the Met Office website, or their social media accounts, for the latest information. Our council colleagues are also providing updates, please consult the relevant website or social media accounts for your local area. This will be particularly useful for road closures. We shared the NHS Scotland interim national arrangements for adverse weather yesterday; in case you missed it, it is available here (intranet link), with the relevant guidance starting on page 3. SSEN are reminding all customers to call 105 to report any loss of supply or damage to power lines. You may also wish to download their Power Track app, which will give you details of power outages and restoration times.

Pensions update Earlier this month we shared an FAQ about changes to the pension scheme which came into effect on 1 October. In case you missed it, it is attached to the email used to send this brief. Please read it carefully, remember the pay received at the end of October (for those paid monthly) will reflect these pension changes.

Server maintenance – POSTPONED The scheduled server maintenance and downtime which was originally planned for Tuesday 24 October between 5-10am has been **postponed**. All systems will be available as normal. A new date will be confirmed and sent out in advance so you can action accordingly.

International infection prevention & control week – personal protective equipment. Our weeklong series of articles to mark this global safety campaign today focuses on personal protective equipment (PPE). You should use PPE whenever there is an expectation of possible exposure to infectious material. Make sure you know the sequence of putting on (donning) and taking off (doffing) PPE to reduce the risk of contamination. Patient Christmas Presents Each year NHS Grampian Charity (formerly Endowment Funds) invites staff to apply for funding to buy a small Christmas gift for patients who will be spending the festive period in hospital without their loved ones.
