**National Transfusion Record** This went live in NHS Grampian on the 20<sup>th</sup> of November. Please note that this replaces the current prescription paperwork for transfusion and therefore when printing a request form from the ERFS a prescription chart will not automatically print. Please ensure your teams are aware as IT have had a large volume of queries relating to this.

Requesting a post-operative sample – wound swab, fluid/tissue etc? We need your help! As patients are being discharged earlier, most post-op samples are taken in the community by practice nurses, community nurses and GPs. We're delighted to say there is now a new request in the ICE system. It's a post-surgical wound sample rather than the ordinary microbiology one. The SSI symptoms are listed for the requester, with tick boxes, enabling microbiology and clinical teams to look at the list and work out whether the patient has an infection or is simply colonised. 

Essential works – Baird Family Hospital A section of road outside RACH will be closed from 6am this Saturday (25 November) to allow for essential works on the Baird Family Hospital site. The red arrows in the map below show the route to be taken by emergency vehicles from the helipad only. Resus and RACH ambulances leaving the helipad should use location 1, all other ambulances leaving the helipad should use location 2.
