

COVID-19 testing & self-isolation for health & social care staff We have received updated guidance on the process for testing & self-isolation for health & social care staff. If your role does NOT bring you into direct contact with patients/clients, then you should follow the same 'Stay at Home' advice given to the general public if you test positive on a Lateral Flow Device without symptoms and/or develop respiratory symptoms, remembering to inform your line manager of your situation. The full guidance for staff in this group is available on the NHS Inform website.

If your role brings you into direct contact with patients/clients – and this could include (for example) ward receptionists and porters, as well as clinical staff – the testing and self-isolation flowchart has been updated. It has been attached to the email used to send out this brief <u>and is also available to view here</u>. Please follow this flowchart from today and discard any previous versions you may have.

If you have symptoms suggestive of COVID-19, you no longer need a PCR test - you should take an LFD test. The staff PCR testing service will no longer be available. LFD test kits remain available to all members of staff, regardless of your role. If you have not yet joined the scheme, <u>you can register here</u>.
