NHS Grampian Password Policy As an organisation, we moved to a new password policy on 1 March. When you are next prompted to change your password, the following rules apply:

- Your password must be no less than 12 characters long.
- Capitals, special characters (e.g., ! or ?), and numbers won't be enforced, but if you can include them, great! It is good practice.
- Your password should consist of three unique random words (e.g., Toast RiverTree)

These changes mean you will only be prompted to change your password once and a year and it should be easier to remember.
