Microbiology postal kits reminder The mailing envelopes for sample kits have been phased out. These kits will not be suitable for returning samples via Royal Mail; samples must be returned to the GP practice or clinic to enable transport to the laboratory with the routine courier collection. Use of the mailing envelopes via Royal Mail may result in the sample not being received by the laboratory.

Where appropriate, please encourage samples to be collected at time of GP or clinic appointment. These can be returned via the standard laboratory courier service. Where this is not deemed appropriate or possible, then encourage the patient to return the sample to their GP practice for collection via the standard laboratory courier service.

Updates following the last session:

Paul Allen, Director of Infrastructure and Sustainability, and his team have provided the following updates:

- Motorbike Parking at Foresterhill this will be included in the upcoming car parking review.
- Bike lockers utilisation The teams are investigating the extent to which lockers are allocated but not used and will update via the Daily Brief in the next few weeks. They have confirmed that there is currently no waiting list for these lockers.
- Request for more bike sheds This suggestion will be considered for action at a future NHSG Transportation Oversight Group. As always, this will be subject to funding availability.
