



The Denburn/Northfield/Mastrick (Aurora) Development Project

NHS Grampian, the Aberdeen City Health & Social Care Partnership (ACHSCP) and the Denburn/Aurora Medical Practice Grouping are working together to create new, better places to access primary and community care services. This will be for the communities of Denburn, Northfield and Mastrick.

What are primary and community care services? Primary and community care services are the day-to-day services available in your local area and the first place people go to when they need health advice or treatment. This could include your GP, chemists, or community nurses (for example).

What do I need to know?

- A new health and care centre will be built in the Greenferns area, which is next to the Orchard Brae and Heathryburn schools. Most patients will go here.
- Following a vote, including on Facebook and at our engagement events, the new building will be called the **Greenferns Health and Care Centre**.
- For patients who live in the city centre, the practice will maintain a city centre presence, relocating to the Health Village on Frederick Street. This will coincide with the opening of the Greenferns Health and Care Centre around spring 2021.

What will happen next?

- We will start building the new health centre in early 2020. The building should be finished by around spring 2021.
- If you currently go to the doctor at Denburn, Mastrick or Northfield, you will go to either the Greenferns Health and Care Centre or the Health Village for your primary and community care services.
- You do not need to do anything now. You will get a letter nearer the time which will tell you what you might need to do.
